MISSION STATEMENT

The Haddon Heights Public Schools, in partnership with our students, families, and communities, will provide diverse, challenging, and enriching learning experiences with the goal of developing excellent scholars, creative, successful individuals, and ethical, responsible citizens who will meet or exceed the New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards at all grade levels.

SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Haddon Heights, NJ is a suburb of Philadelphia, PA and is comprised of approximately 7,500 residents. Our high school, part of the Colonial Conference in southern New Jersey, offers courses for every level of ability and includes a wide array of Honors and Advanced Placement courses. Opportunities are maximized for inclusion for the special needs students. A full complement of extracurricular sports and clubs allows students to broaden a full range of interests and skills. The rich fabric of our student body is enhanced by a diverse population, coming to us from the neighboring communities of Barrington, Lawnside and Merchantville (starting with the Class of 2019)

Haddon Heights is a School Choice District and information is posted on the District Website. More specifically, grade level seat availability is posted in September and all applications are due to the district in the beginning of December.

This diversity accounts for approximately thirty percent of our student body. Haddon Heights High School is a comprehensive junior/senior high and has an approximate enrollment of eight hundred and fifty students in grades seven through twelve. The average class size in academic subjects is eighteen to twenty-two. Haddon Heights High School offers a schedule that includes an extended lab period once a week for all classes. The high school is on a four-quarter marking period system. Students may participate in nine boys' athletic varsity teams, nine girls' athletic varsity teams, as well as co-ed swimming and golf. Thirty-two clubs and organizations are sponsored, including a National Championship Marching Unit and Color Guard.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 120 credits is required for graduation and includes the following New Jersey state requirements:

- Four years of English
- Physical Education & related Health classes for every year enrolled
- Three years of Mathematics
- Three years of Science
- Two years of United States History
- One year of World History
- One year of Foreign Language
- One year of Integrated Computer Practices / Practical Arts
- One year of Fine and Performing Arts
- One half year of Financial Literacy

CURRICULUM HIGHLIGHTS

Currently, **Honors courses** are offered in English I – IV, World History and Cultures, US History I & II, Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra 2/Trig, Pre-Calculus, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish III and IV, and French III and IV, **Advanced Placement courses** are offered in ten areas including Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, English Language, English Literature / Composition, European History, Physics 1 & 2, Spanish, Statistics and US History. In May 2015, 67 AP exams were taken in six subject areas.

DUAL CREDIT – Various courses are offered as Dual Credit in conjunction with Camden County College. Students will have the opportunity to earn college credits for completing the courses here at Haddon Heights. There is a registration fee for the college course and students must earn a minimum of a B average to earn credits. Students who successfully earn credits will receive a transcript from Camden County College.

GRADES, GPA, & RANK

All students and all courses are considered in determining **Grade Point Average** and class rank.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

The **WEIGHTED Grade Point Average** is calculated by multiplying the grade of full year courses by 1, three marking period courses by .75, semester courses by .50, and quarter courses by .25. It also gives additional weight to students taking Honor and AP courses. Honors course grades are weighted by 1.075 and AP courses are weighted by 1.1.

CLASS RANK

Junior rank is calculated after 6 semesters. Final **Grade Point Average** and rank are computed after the third marking period, senior year.
